

Direct to Indirect Prompts

DIRECT	INDIRECT
1. I don't think that's such a good idea.	<i>Do you think that's a good idea? Are there any other ideas? I like most parts of that idea.</i>
2. That's not the point.	<i>That's an interesting point. That's <u>another</u> good point. Hum, I hadn't thought of that.</i>
3. I think we should....	<i>I have another possible suggestion...? What do you think of this idea? Could we consider...?</i>
4. What do you think, Mr. Cato? <i>(Calling on people sometimes embarrasses them. How can you find out what Mr. Cato thinks without directly asking him?)</i>	<i>Does anyone else have any suggestions? Have we heard all the opinions? I'm not sure this is the way to do it.</i>
5. Those figures are not accurate.	<i>I have some other figures here. Can someone recheck the figures? Those figures may be slightly old.</i>
6. You're doing that wrong.	<i>I would do that like this. Have you tried doing that this way? Maybe I've misunderstood how this is done.</i>
7. I don't agree.	<i>What do you think of this idea? May I make a suggestion? Okay.</i>

Indirect to Direct Prompts

INDIRECT	DIRECT
1. That is a very interesting viewpoint.	<i>I don't agree. We need to talk more about this. You're wrong.</i>
2. This proposal deserves further consideration.	<i>We don't like it. It needs work. Propose something else.</i>
3. I know very little about this, but....	<i>I'm something of an expert on this but am too polite to say so. What I think we should do is ... You've done that wrong.</i>
4. We understand your proposal very well.	<i>Do you have another one? We don't like it. And we are not happy with it.</i>
5. We will try our best.	<i>Don't expect much to happen. We're not happy with it. This is not what we thought we'd be responsible for.</i>
6. I heard another story about that project.	<i>I don't agree with what you said about that project. That project had problems. I wouldn't associate with them if I were you.</i>
7. Can we move on to the next topic?	<i>We don't want to talk about this now. We need to consult with people not in the room before we decide. I disagree.</i>

Example scenarios

1. You are waiting in line at the grocery store and someone cuts in front of you.
2. You and a friend are going to go to dinner. You have a place in mind you'd like to go.
3. You are in class and there is a no cell phone policy. You keep hearing a classmate's cell phone buzzing and it's making it difficult for you to focus on your work.
4. Your sibling has decided they like song writing. They perform a new song for the family and you don't think it's very good.
5. You accidentally dropped your fork on the floor at a restaurant and need a new one. The server hasn't checked in at your table for awhile.
6. You see an acquaintance from school at a hockey game with a group of friends.
7. Someone bumps into in the hallway.
8. You are at a store and want to buy something but you're not sure how much it costs.
9. A friend is going to a concert and you really want to go to.
10. You're at dinner with family and someone tells a joke you don't understand.
